Prospective applicants must have at least a 3.7 GPA.

Description: The National Association of Hispanic Journalists (NAHJ) offers several scholarships through our Rubén Salazar Scholarship Fund program. Name of Scholarship: The National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate Fellowship Program (NDSEG)

Target population: U.S. Citizens

Level of Study: At or near the beginning of their graduate studies in science and/or engineering programs.

Description: This fellowship program is sponsored by the Army Research Office, Office of Naval Research, Air Force Office of Scientific Research and the DoD High Performance Computing Modernization Program. The fellowships are for three year tenures. The stipends begin at \$30,500 for first year fellows, \$31,000 for second year fellows and \$31,500 for third year fellows. Full tuition and fees and a health insurance allowance are included as part of the program.

Name of Scholarship: The National Science Foundation's Graduate Research Fellowship Program

Target population: U.S. citizens, nationals, or permanent resident aliens

Level of Study: Graduate students in the Chemistry, Computer and Information Science and Engineering, Engineering, Geosciences, Life Sciences, Mathematical Sciences, Physics and Astronomy, Psychology, and Social Sciences

Description: This fellowship program provides students with three years of financial support including a \$30,000 annual stipend and \$10,500 cost-of-education allowance.

Name of Scholarship: The Naval Research Laboratory (NRL) Postdoctoral Fellowship Program

Target population: U.S. citizens and legal permanent residents

Level of Study: Postdoctoral

Description: This program offers a competitive stipend as well as insurance, relocation, and travel allowances. This program offers one to three year postdoctoral fellowships designed to increase the involvement of scientists and engineers from academia and industry to scientific and technical areas of interest and relevance to the Navy. Level of Study: Undergraduate and Graduate

Description: The Hispanic Scholarship Fund (HSF) is the nation's preeminent organization supporting Hispanic higher education. Founded in 1975 as a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization, HSF's vision is to strengthen the country by advancing college education among Hispanic Americans. In support of its mission to double the rate of Hispanics earning college degrees, HSF provides the Latino community more college scholarships and educational outreach support than any other organization in the country. During the 2006-2007 academic year, HSF awarded nearly 4,200 scholarships exceeding \$26.5 million. In its 32-year history, HSF has awarded more than 82,000 scholarships worth more than \$221 million to Latinos from all 50 states, Puerto Rico, Guam and the U.S. Virgin Islands attending nearly 2,000 colleges and universities.
